Quilters by the Sea 2015-16 Calendar

April 7: General Meeting, Judy Lancaster Trunk Show: Judy is the star instructor at RYCO and has made some fantastic quilts to share with you.




May 5: General Meeting, QBS Member Judy Messenger Trunk Show.

We will keep it simple. Remember ROYGBIV from Art Class 101?

R = Red for September 2015

O = Orange for October 2015

Y = Yellow for November 2015

G = **Green** for December 2015

B = Blue for January 2016

I = Indigo for February (Think Blue Jean Blues) 2016

V = Violet for March 2016

Solids for April 2016

Black for May 2016

White for June 2016

Any print, shade, pattern or value of the color is acceptable, as well as bits of other colors. There are many free patterns using these strip sets available online or at your Public Library (search "jelly roll quilts"). Questions? Email Christine Bagley.

Guild Opportunities

Being a member of the guild means participating in decisions, projects, sharing ideas and helping each other to learn and enjoy their quilting experiences. As we head into the next two years, there are opportunities for members to meet new people, help out with our projects, participate in activities, learn new techniques and generally grow in our shared quilting lives. Here are some ways you can help the guild:

Hospitality: we will need some volunteers (more fun in a group) to organize the refreshments offered at the meetings. This involves coming early to the meetings (about 6-6:15) to set up the table and put out the items brought in by other members. They also organize the list for sign-up and make sure the area is clean before leaving. You also get to socialize with everyone who comes by the table!

➤ Each month a few people are needed to supply food and water for this, so please sign up at least once during the year.

Community Service: This is an opportunity to lead our efforts to support those in need in our community. In the past we have donated many items to children and families and in order to continue this, we need someone willing to organize us. The guild members will support you, we will be more productive with someone to focus our efforts. Donna Chaves, who has been doing a fantastic job at this is willing to help the next leader.

Membership: Susan Vanderhoof has been working with Barbara for the past year and is willing to take over as the membership person for the guild. She would like someone to help her. This involves coming to the meetings a bit early, by 6:30, and helping to check in the people as they arrive, as well as helping Susan in any other related tasks (record keeping, membership lists, etc.) This is a great way to meet everyone and learn names to go with the faces you see each month at the meetings!

We will help you learn what needs to be done and hope everyone is able to participate in some way. By the way, I hope you are all working on some quilts to put in the show!

There may be other opportunities I have forgotten, so please feel free to bring them up to me. If you want to let me know what you are interested in doing, email or call me or talk to me at the June meeting. Hope to see you there.

As we take a break for the summer, I hope you will think about how you can become an active member of the Quilters by the Sea. Keep your eyes open for ideas for the show, ways to teach others what you know, share your projects. Over the summer I hope you have plenty of opportunities to sew, places and things to inspire you, and time to get together with friends and family to relax and sew!
